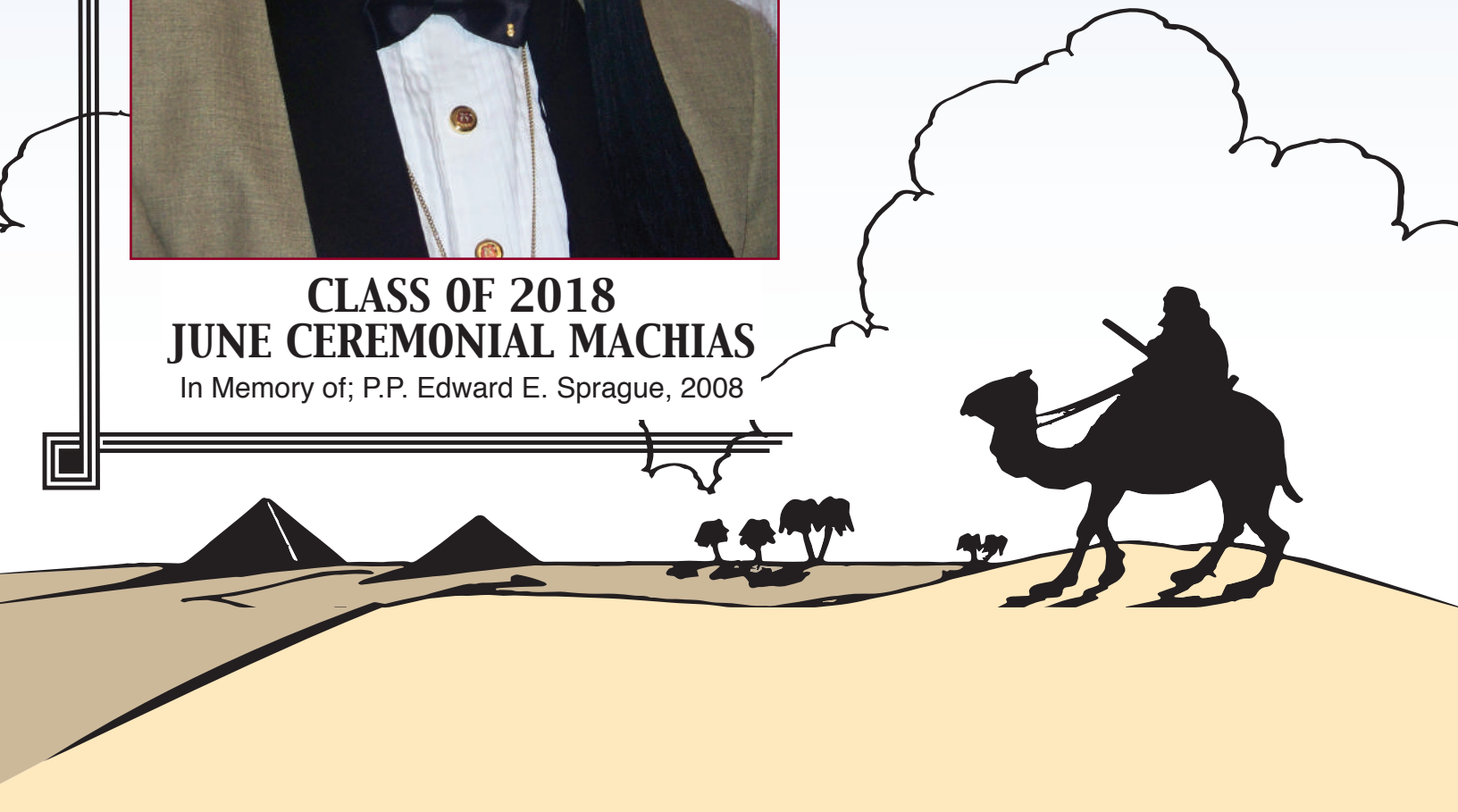

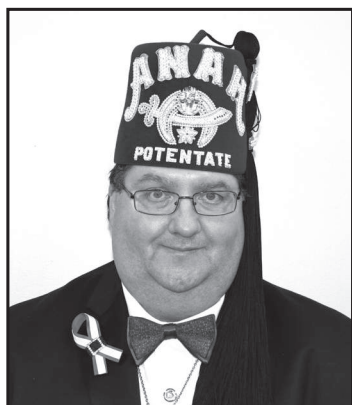

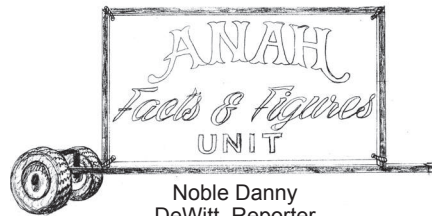

We may have another split event on 9/29 with Carmel Days and Autumn Gold both that day.

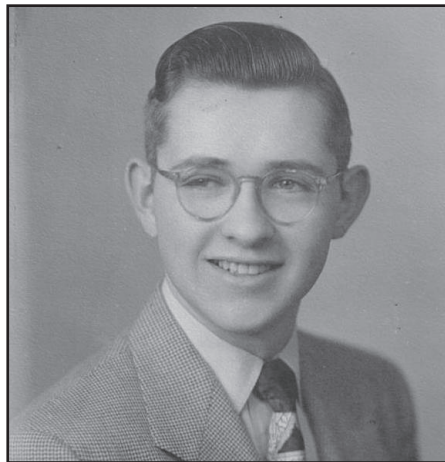
