Anah Shrine is proud to welcome our new nobles to the fraternity. Anah's newest members and their ladies were treated to a wonderfully fun filled weekend of camaraderie and fellowship as the Machias community put on a fabulous display of hospitality while it greeted us for our 2018 Summer Ceremonial, Parade and more than 400 of us for our Saturday night Bar-B-Que and banquet.

With the arrival of summer, also comes with it the annual trek of our hierarchy to "Imperial Session", being held again this year in beautiful (And Hot) Daytona Beach Florida. The highlight of the session (We hope) will be the conclusion of the year long struggle between Shriners International and our beloved Imperial Recorder, Anah's own Imperial Sir' Randy Rudge. Our Potentate has worked tirelessly to help right the atrocities that have been levied against Randy since he was unanimously elected to his position at last year's session. If you are not aware, Shriners International Imperial Recorder has not had an office, a staff nor a pay check since the day that he was elected last July.

The politically motivated battle between Randy and Tampa appear to be the product of the future aspirations of some (Or, at least one) of our current Imperial Divan officers. While the struggles have been publicly addressed at both the Northeast Shrine Associations "Mid-Winter" meeting as well as at the annual Shrine Recorders Association conference, answers as to why this has happened have been hard to come by. The representatives of Anah Shrine who have taken it upon themselves to delve into the situation have been emphatically told that the Imperial officers are under a "Gag Rule" and instructed "Not" to answer questions when asked.

The "Call" (The publication describing the various items of legislation to be addressed at the imperial session) lists two separate articles dealing directly with Imperial Sir Rudge's situation:

Item #3, Article #6 I m p e r i a l By-Laws currently state "The Imperial Recorder SHALL be paid an annual salary in such amount as Shriners International

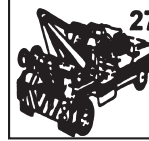

SHALL provide. [The legislation being put forward by several of our imperial divan officers wants to change the "Shall" in both instances to "May", thus attempting to eliminate the requirement of Shriners International to compensate Randy for his work. This article should, and needs to be stricken down during this session.

Greetings Nobles and Ladies. I'm writing this in June, so I'm reporting on things that are to be, and not necessarily things that have been. Since the last report, the lads have attended the Special Olympics at UMO. For many years after that, Cliff has hosted the band for a barbeque after the short parade. The next event on our agenda is the graduation at the College of the Atlantic. This is a nice event. It is on the ocean and we prepare in one of the schools buildings called Turrets. It is a very large granite block mansion that they use for administrative offices and classrooms. The building was a rich dudes wedding gift to his young wife. I'll get back to this theme in a paragraph or two.

Our next event is the Ceremonial in



Machias. Congratulations to Illustrious Brad Prout on being Potentate. Brad has been a long-time supporter of the Highlanders. We all hope that his year is filled with momentous achievements for the Shrine and its Charities. From there, we have a couple weeks off and we hit Bar Harbor on the 4th and the Fort Knox Tattoo on the 7th. Elements of the band will play at the Rockport Masonic lodge on Wednesday July 11th (the lodge has a supper and entertainment). On the 21st of July the band is scheduled to play in the Lincoln homecoming parade. On July 22nd we will perform a concert for the Belfast Celtic festival. We have the Shrine field day parade in Calais on August 11th. Our calendar goes into October with parades and events.

It may not seem it, but this is a lighter parade load than normal. I know several of the band members that still work have a hard time making all the parades. When we get asked to do a parade, we canvas the membership and try to get an accurate head count. We not only need a large enough number of Pipers and Drummers, but it has to contain enough of the "right" members. We have beginners, intermediates, and experienced members. In order to maintain the quality to which our fans are accustomed, we need to have enough experienced members to hold the intermediates and beginners together. For the band president and the pipe major, it is a stressful and sometimes daunting task.

I previously mentioned a very elaborate wedding gift. It is hard for those of us in rural northern Maine to fathom that type of wealth. It isn't realistic for everyone to give their new bride a mansion on the ocean, but I think we can do better than treating them to an item of their choice off the dollar menu at McDonalds. I have to be careful here, because this is a big picture rant that goes, in part, to the heart of our Masonic beliefs.

Throughout northern Maine, we have Churches, Masonic Lodges, and public schools that are struggling for members, and as a result are struggling to pay basic utilities. I could give names, but I don't have to, because we all know of examples. There are some reasons for this. One: it is VERY expensive to have kids. FACT: Medical costs and college costs have gone up at more than twice the rate of inflation for over 40 years (in most years they are both double digit increase per year). Two: we as a population have either said NO or indirectly said NO to opportunities that would have provided good jobs. Sorry to say, but endlessly tying things up with "red tape" so that every bureaucrat in the bowels

of government can put their personal stamp of approval on it is saying NO. Third: of our working population, there are an unacceptable number of people that do not or cannot work because of drug addiction.

If I haven't been censured, Masonry can help with some of these points. There isn't much we can do about the cost of college or medical care, but some Masonic lodges that have young members, may find a business opportunity in providing affordable child care (this is where the Eastern Star could Help). It may help to get more young members into the lodge. WE are not a political organization, but it makes sense to encourage people to vote. WE cannot tell them who to vote for, but helping members that are not able to get out is our civic duty. Finally, Masonic values need to be on the minds of all members and their families. Recreational drug use is dangerous and counterproductive. Research shows that a teen that regularly smokes marijuana is 5 TIMES more likely to become schizophrenic. Other drugs

like Meth can kill on just one use. A drug that is becoming increasingly popular is Fentanyl. It is a powerful synthetic opioid analgesic that is similar to morphine but is 50 to 100 times more potent. I'm told it is so potent that you can overdose on it simply by touching it. I know young people that lost battles with drug addiction. Sometimes they are good people with good hearts that lost a battle, which followed a few bad choices. Or from an insurance company that prescribed pills instead of providing an operation.

Like I said, As Masons, we cannot do much about the first two listed causes of Northern Maine's poverty, but we can sure insist that Hiram's values are on the for front of EVERYTHING we do. Furthermore, we should strongly encourage everyone around us to do the same. We cannot wallow in the gutter and expect to live in a mansion on a hill.
