



Today, July 23rd, the band is scheduled to perform in the Lincoln Loon Festival Parade. This is a great small-town event that is always well attended. We always enjoy it. It looks like our next event is Island Falls on Aug 7th, for their 150th anniversary. Then on to Monson, on the 20th, for their 200th anniversary. We have 2 events scheduled for the first two weekends in October. It is good to see that life is starting to resemble shadows of normalcy.

Getting back to July 4th, our nations "Declaration of Independence". I don't think our public schools are giving justice to the immense sacrifices that the founding fathers gave. Many of them lost their fortunes or lives during the revolution. In his series, "The History of the English Speaking Peoples", Sir Winston Churchill described the "Quarrel With America". The Boston Tea Party was brought on by Parliament's bailout of the British East India Co., which was nearly bankrupt. Along with the tax, it required that all tea (and it seems some other goods also) had to be purchased from the British East India Co. This requirement meant that all of the importers and wholesalers of tea, in the colonies, were going to be forced out of business, according to Churchill. It was that fact that led to the Tea Party.

I'd recommend EVERYONE including children, to watch a mini-series called Adams. It starts around the time of the Boston Massacre and ends at the end of Adam's life (July 4, 1826). I find recent mischaracterizations of the founding fathers appalling. Many of them were Masons. Our nation was founded by good people, not perfect, who fought a monstrous ternary, and against all odds, prevailed. They developed a system and framework that led to more prosperity and freedom than any other country before or since.






